- Trauma is healable
- Trauma informed principles are the solution and puts the spirituality back into our healthcare system
- Rural poverty. Realized that the medical system ignores the societal issues.

- Trying to help put down the lens of today and look at relationships and love. How could this person be related to me. Created a brief intervention within a system that doesn't support the work that she was doing.

- Few weeks ago left primary care because wants to advocate patients in another way and wants to support and put energy into helping other providers how to learn a way that can easily integrate into the system

- Made a film "The Faces of ACES" (now working on her forth film) and wants to bring this information to the Governor to have Vermont be the first trauma informed state.
